
SUPPLEMENT BY SGT'S WEHR AND KING, SEQUENTIAL LINEUP, WITNESS B

On 5/19/04 at approximately 1600 hours, Sgt. D. Mattson and Sgt. Keefe, requested that investigators respond to the home of Witness B to show a sequential lineup and interview this witness.

Sgt. Wehr introduced himself to the witness and the witness provided personal information to Sgt. Wehr. Sgt. Wehr informed the witness that he was going to be showing a series of six photographs, one at a time, to the witness. Sgt. Wehr informed the witness that the witness was not obligated to pick anyone out of the lineup and that a suspect may or may not be in the lineup. Sgt. Wehr informed witness that the witness was to tell Sgt. Wehr if witness recognized anyone of the subjects in the lineup. Sgt. Wehr advised the witness in the case of an identification, Sgt Wehr would continue showing the remaining photographs. Sgt. Wehr told the witness that he had no knowledge of this case, and would be unable to answer any follow up questions the witness may have.

Sgt. Wehr then showed witness B the series of photographs sequentially. Witness B gave responses to photos 1-4 by shaking witness head negatively. When witness B was shown photo number 5, witness stated "hold on to that one". Sgt. Wehr then showed photo number six and witness stated " he looks like the other one".

After completing the first presentation of the lineup, Sgt. Wehr asked witness if witness wanted to look at the sequential lineup a second time. Witness B asked to see the lineup a second time, stating "to be sure". Sgt. Wehr then showed the series of photographs to witness sequentially. Witness B gave negative responses to photos 1-4. When shown photograph number 5, witness stated "thats the one I saw at the Rose Shop". Photograph number 6 was shown and witness stated "its not him, but it looks like the guy that was with the other guy (number 5) on Mothers Day.

Sgt. Wehr asked witness to initial and date the photograph, (number 5), which witness selected.

Sgt. Wehr gave the sequential lineup to Sgt. Keefe, and he took it into his custody.

Sgt. King then interviewed Witness B. Witness B told Sgt. King that on Sunday, May 16th, at what the witness thought was approximately 11:30 a.m., the witness was on a break from church services and decided to walk to the "Chinese Store" with a friend. The witness stated that on their way to the "Chinese Store", they passed by a male, later ID'd in photograph #5, that they had seen on two previous occasions. The witness stated that the witness and the friend of the witness had seen this male on Mothers Day. The witness stated that the witness thought this male was going to bother them again, as he had in the recent past.

The witness went on to state that on Mother's Day, this same male approached the witness and the friend of the witness, begging for money. The witness stated that this male then engaged in conversation with the witness and friend regarding their clothing. The witness stated that later in the day on Mother's Day, the witness and friend saw this male with a second male, who looked similar to the person in photograph #6. The witness stated that this male and his friend stood across the street from the "Rose Shop" on Lyndale, south of 33rd Ave No. The witness stated that the two "looked like they were planning something".

The witness was concerned, as the witness felt as though this male was going to pester them for money again. The witness and friend left the area.

The witness then returned to explaining what happened on Sunday, May 16.

The witness repeated that as the witness and friend walked to the store, the male in photograph #5 walked by them and "meanmugged" them. The witness stated that this male appeared to be wearing dark-colored sweatpants and a light colored top, possibly white or

grey. The witness stated that they watched this male walk quickly, in the direction of the "Rose Shop". The witness stated that after they left the "Chinese Store", they were walking around the area. The witness stated that as the witness and friend neared Jerry's Flower Shop, the witness heard a gunshot, and saw this same male that he identified in photograph #5

come running out of the front door. The witness stated that the witness was between 30 and 40 feet from this male, and was certain that this was the same male he had seen minutes earlier, and previously on Mother's Day.

The witness stated that following the gunshot, the friend ran away and did not see the male leave the store. The witness stated that the witness then left the area and returned to church. The witness stated that after the church service, the witness saw police officers surrounding the area of the flower shop.

The witness stated that while watching the news, the witness saw that someone had been murdered at the flower shop. The witness stated that the witness contacted the police to provide possible witness information.
