Supplement of Sgt Rod Timmerman. Crime Lab Unit. 5-27-04

On 5-26-04 at approx 0900 hrs, I called the Property and Evidence Unit Warehouse and requested personnel to pull PI #04-14726 Line 1 and Line 3 from storage and make it available for processing. This is per a service order request submitted to our office from homicide investigators Sgt Mattson and Sgt Keefe.

Line 1 consists of a twelve shelf wheeled greeting card display that was inventoried by investigators. This originally was against the south wall of Jerry's Flower Shop just east of the main entryway door. This item contains numerous greeting cards and envelopes.

Line 3 consists of a three shelf small card display with numerous cards that was also inventoried by investigators. This was originally located on the counter near the cash register of Jerry's Flower Shop.

FS Kari Mink, FS Amy Wheeler, FS Amy Miller and I arrived at the warehouse at approx 1500 hrs and processed each of the cards on these shelving units. No identifiable latents were developed on any of the small cards on the three shelf unit from the front counter.

Five cards processed on the wheeled display contained partial fingerprints that were covered with fingerprint tape for protection, signed out from the warehouse and brought back to our office for examination purposes.

On today's day, Minneapolis Police inked fingerprint card #882057 was pulled from our files for comparison purposes. This card bears the name MARVIN HAYNES, DOB/ 12-6-87.

All latents were compared to all inked impressions on this fingerprint card. No identification was made.

The five greeting cards will be taken to the Property and Evidence Unit.
