10:45 Saturday - All Activists will arrive Park & Ride [1-81, Wapwallopen, Pennsylvania 18660], condense vehicles and equipment, as well as confirm drivers have Lake Rose Trail-head Parking location. [GPS Coordinates 41.32980, -76.29145]

11:00 Saturday - Attendance will be taken and gear will be checked by Vincent\_NY & Eric\_PA. All phones will be powered down and marked with the associated activists alias. Confiscated phones will be carried by Vincent\_NY until the event is concluded.

11:15 Saturday - Activists will depart from Park & Ride and head to Lake Rose Trail-head Parking.

12:30 Saturday - Activists will arrive at Lake Rose Trail-head Parking location. Attendance will be taken and gear will be checked by Eric\_PA

12:40 Saturday - Activists will hike Falls trail led by Jackson\_PA. Total hike time is expected to be 5 hours, with a half hour break accounted for.

14:30 Saturday - Activists will pause the hike to eat and take a small break. If the area is suitable, readings can be done from "Why Activism/Fundamentals/Etc".

15:00 Saturday - Activists will continue the hike.

17:40 Saturday - Activists will rally at Lake Rose Trail-head Parking lot. Attendance will be taken by Eric\_PA. Activists will drive back to Park & Ride to conclude event.

18:40 Saturday - Activists will arrive at Park & Ride and attendance will be taken by Eric\_PA. Phones will be handed back to members upon saying their name. Vincent\_NY will ensure those who need stickers get their share.

19:00 Saturday - Activists will return home and sticker at least one location before the end of the night.

## **[GEAR] :**

### **Individual Packing List**

**Travel Clothing:** All travel clothing items must be politically neutral, prioritize dull colors, absence of revealing marks or identifying features such as company logos, college icons, or city references. Multiple layers for weather changes.

Average temperature along the travel route will be in 50's

- Hat (Cap, booney, etc)
- Sunglasses
- Medical Style Mask
- Compliant shirt, pants, shoes/boots (No open toed shoes.)

**Activism Dress Code:** Activism dress code is only to be worn on command. Its contents are to remain neatly stored, clean and undamaged during travel.

It is expected to rain at some point during the day. Every member must have a poncho or waxed jacket, along with multiple layers to stay dry and warm.

Note: Research on trail shows this may be somewhat populated. Activism dress code will be mixed use of travel, and activism dress code. This is up to personal preference, but we expect that you appear presentable and that your items of wear are appropriate but functional.

- Cap w/ Chevron Patch
- Blank white Mask or Medical Style Mask
- Well fitting, appropriate shirt and/or sweater
- Jacket or Windbreaker
- Khaki or tan colored pants
- Appropriate boots

**Additional Items:** Optional or non-necessary items will be marked with an ^.

- Day Pack
- Rain Poncho
- Headlamp or Flashlight
- Healthy Snacks
- At least 1 Liter of water
- Lunch
- First Aid Kit ^
- Organizational Literature ^
- Bug-spray ^
- Radio ^

**Note:** Please pack as little plastic with you as possible. All trash must be taken with you. Do not expect to be able to dispose of it anywhere during the hike.
