AFFIDAVIT OF ISIAH HARPER

I, Isiah Harper, under penalty of perjury, state as follows:

- 1. In August 2005, I testified at the criminal trial of Marvin Haynes, Jr. Marvin was accused of murdering Harry Sherer at Jerry's Flower Shop in Minneapolis on May 16, 2004.
- 2. After that murder, Minneapolis police officers contacted me for information suggesting that Marvin was the perpetrator. At first, I told them the truth, which is that I did not know anything about the murder. The officers would not accept that answer. They kept pressuring me and threatened me with criminal charges if I did not cooperate. They told me that I could get half of the prison time Marvin was facing if I did not help. At one point, they put me in a jail cell for what was probably an hour or so before bringing me back out and continuing to interrogate me.
- 3. I was only 14 years old at the time. I was scared and confused. I felt I had no choice but to tell the officers what they wanted to hear. So I lied to them. I told them that I had been with Marvin and others at a friend's home on the morning of the killing and that Marvin said he was going to "hit a lick," slang for commit a robbery. I also told them Marvin called me later that same day and said he had shot a white man because the man would not give him any money. These statements were

not true. I never heard Marvin say anything of the type or anything else that would tie him to this murder in any way.

- 4. While the officers did record my final statement, most of the lengthy questioning leading up to that statement was not recorded.
- 5. When I was called to testify at Marvin's trial, I tried to recant on the stand. I testified that these prior statements against Marvin were false and that I had felt pressured by police to make them. The judge eventually stopped my testimony, and I was taken out of the court room. During the break, the prosecutors said I could go to prison if I did not tell the truth. I was told to say what I had said during my police interrogation. When I returned to the stand, I changed my story back to what I had said during the interrogation. I did not feel like I had any choice since they were threatening me with criminal charges.
- 6. Now I want to tell the truth one more time. I never heard Marvin Haynes say that day that he was going to "hit a lick" or commit a robbery or anything like that. Marvin never told me after the fact that he killed that man. It was all lies that I believed I had to give the police to avoid going to prison myself. Based on everything I know, I believe Marvin is innocent and that he had nothing to do with the murder of Harry Sherer.

I declare under penalty of perjury that everything I have stated in this document is true and correct.
