to the south there is a refrigerated display for flowers. As you walk past this display there is a hallway to the east. Blood from the victim extends from his body all the way back through this hallway. The MFD personnel pulled the victim out of this hallway so that they would have more room to work on his body. Walking past the hallway there is another refrigerated display of flowers. As you get to the south wall of the interior there is another hallway to the back of the building. On the south wall of the building there is another refrigerated display and a card rack next to the main entrance at the southwest corner of the building.

It should be noted that as you walk through the hallways to the east there is office space and break room areas for the employees and staff.

The following evidence was collected from the scene by MPD Crime Lab Personnel: 2 bullets, one card and holder and latent prints. The green wrapping paper from the counter was initially removed by K9 Officer STENDER and placed in a brown paper bag. After the dogs obtained a scent from this paper, Officer STENDER gave me the green paper to inventory as evidence. Officer STENDER used a 35-mm camera to photograph the paper before he removed it. The camera was inventoried as evidence for processing. I turned the green paper over to FS TIMMERMAN. The green paper was removed from the scene prior to the arrival of crime lab personnel so that Officer STENDER could initiate a track as soon as possible. The M.E. cleared from the scene at approximately 1615 hours. Investigators cleared from the scene at approximately 1700 hours.
