
SUPPLEMENT OF SGTs KERPE AND MATTSON, TYPED BY KP, CCN 04-117071

On 10/16/2004 while reviewing this case SGT KEEFE noticed that the clothes that deft HAYNES was wearing when he was arrested for his juvenile warrant on 5/19/2004, had not been submitted to the BCA. The prosecutor MIKE FURNSTAHL was advised of this and told that investigators would collect the clothes on Monday the 18th of October and submit them to the MPD crime lab for initial analysis.

On 10/18/2004 SGT MATTSON and SGT KEEFE went to the MPD property room and recovered the deft's clothing under CCN 04-119969. SGT MATTSON hand carried these clothing items up to the Identification Bureau and met with PS AMY MILLER and PS MIKE NORRIS. Forensic scientists evaluated three pieces of clothing under a black light to determine if there may be any possible blood evidence. The items of clothing were a nylon stocking/headwear, a dark blue sweatshirt, and an outer jacket that was grey on one side and black on the other side and was reversible. PS NORRIS while passing the light over the grey side of the outer jacket, discovered a suspicious stain which reacted to the light. This was on the left side, below the pocket area. They then used a hemastix, which was a presumptive test to identify blood. They told me that the reaction was positive. They then collected samples of this suspected blood with a sterile swab. I also noted as they proceeded from the initial observation of this clothing to collecting of the samples that they photographed the evidence each step of the way.

PS MILLER and SGT MATTSON then hand carried the recovered samples to the property room where MILLER signed them in for evidence and SGT MATTSON signed them out to the BCA lab. SGT MATTSON hand carried these samples as well as the clothing, which was bagged separately over to the BCA to request the suspected BLS be evaluated in this case.
